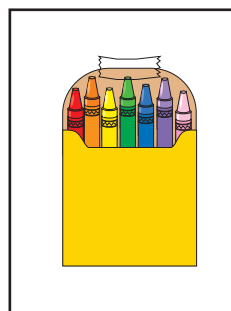
How to print on Shapes Etc. Notepads



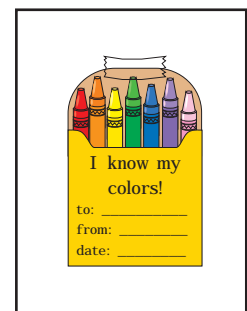
1. Print a document on 8 1/2" x 11" paper. (It might take some experimenting to get the font to fit.)



2. Tape on a sheet of a Crayon Box notepad. Use a good brand of tape, so it's easy to peel off. later.



3. Hold it up to the light and center it. Feed it through the printer so the tape edge feeds in first.



4. The ink prints on the top layer of paper! Carefully pull off the tape... Voila'!
