★ Featured Display: Can-Do Doll

Create an irresistible display that models and celebrates significant learning achievements. Begin with one or two large, blank sheets of cardboard, each about the size of a 5-year-old child. Draw a paper-doll-style boy and/or girl on each, and then cut out. Dress these figures with fabric swatches or cut-out construction paper, and add yarn hair and paper or button eyes. Glue buttons or zippers to the shirts and add shoelaces (or yarn) to the shoes. Secure the figure(s) to your display, and then add the set pieces that list the key skills. You can enhance the display with more objects to represent the skills, such as paper dolls, alphabet cards, and name plates with student-printed names. Children will delight in these new little "friends" as they celebrate all the new skills they have acquired!
